

GRAMMAR TIP #12: NOUN CLAUSES



Noun clauses act as a subject or object in a sentence. They include a clause marker, a subject, and a conjugated verb, but they do not express a complete meaning on their own.

Example of noun clause as subject:

Clause marker Subj of the noun clause Conjugated verb of the noun clause

What students write in response to feedback often reveals their level of metacognitive awareness.

Example of noun clause as object:

The researcher found that students benefited from targeted feedback.

Clause marker Subj of the noun clause Conjugated verb of the noun clause

Common clause markers for noun clauses include:

That, Wh-words, whether/if
